Previously this kitchen was a dark space with little natural light. The fairly cramped area had insufficient room for meal preparation and cooking. So designer Michael Attard and the team from Attard's Kitchens & Cabinetry set about creating a revamped space to the owners' straightforward brief: more storage space, cleaner bench zones and easy access to all areas.

Clear though the requests were, this project wasn't without its challenges. Attard had to contend with space restrictions, maintaining important structural columns and plumbing the area from above.

The first thing you notice when you step into the new space is how clean and uncluttered it is. All appliances are neatly tucked away in a cabinet, leaving the bench areas free for cooking, and

there's a much lighter, airier feel to the space. LED lighting on the stunning feature glass panel and above the overhead cabinets contributes to this, as do the relaxing tones of the CaesarStone benchtop. Practically designed, drawers feature in abundance, offering the homeowners plenty of space to store all their kitchen clutter.
